

SMSC and British Values Policy

SMSC stands for Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural Education. SMSC is embedded into the ethos and character of Highfield Community School and is evidenced throughout the whole curriculum, the life of the school and in discrete teaching within RE, PSED and P4C lessons across the school.

As a Community Primary School, we are committed to serving and being positively engaged in our local, national and global community. We recognise and celebrate the multi-cultural and multi-faith nature of our school and the United Kingdom. We understand the crucial role our school plays in promoting British Values and the Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural education of our children. All of the staff and Governors have a responsibility for supporting and promoting the values which underpin our school.

Spiritual Development:

We encourage our children to reflect on their own beliefs and be respectful of the feelings, values and faiths of others. We encourage them to reflect, respond, question and enquire without judgement or prejudice.

- Assembly Programme, including visitors from local churches and other faith groups; "Open the Book" assemblies led by one of our Governors; Special Assemblies led by Revd. Tina Upton (Harvest, Christingle, End of school year)
- Visits to places of worship and from faith groups.
- Involvement in Blacon Community Carol Service and Cathedral events.
- Whole school RE days; visiting drama workshops and art projects.

<u>Moral Development:</u>

We promote a strong moral code within school, teaching children to understand the difference between right and wrong., respect for our school rules and for civil and criminal law. We encourage children to consider the consequences of their actions. We promote equality and respect and we foster a safe learning environment for all.

- Whole school behaviour policy, which uses rewards and sanctions, the "traffic light system" and certificates and verbal praise.
- Class rules are reviewed and clearly displayed in each class.
- Pupil Voice and Pupil Leadership groups, including School Council, Year 6 Buddies and Anti-Bullying Ambassadors.
- P4C and SEAL sessions in every year group.

Social Development:

We are very much a community school. Our children are willing to participate, contribute and positively cooperate with others. They learn to resolve conflicts effectively, take responsibility and volunteer to take part in a wide range of social activities. We encourage them to take pride in their school, local, national and global community.
